What do these dogs want to say?

The first dog is bowing. It is saying, "I want to play

with you." The dog feels excited, and it wants to

have fun right now.

Look at the second dog. The dog's head is low, its

ears are back, and its tail is down. This body

language shows fear. The dog is scared of

something. It needs to be alone for a moment.

What are these rabbits thinking?

a I feel so comfortable.

b I'm curious about something.

The first rabbit is standing on its back legs. It is

raising its front legs, and its ears are straight. Is it

worried about something? Not really. The rabbit is

curious about something.

The second rabbit is lying down like Superman. It is

stretching its legs. Why is it doing that? Is it sick?
