**Exploring the Dynamic Nature**

– Torres del Paine National Park

Can you believe you can experience four seasons in one day? Torres del Paine National Park in Chile is the perfect place for this. It is famous for its dynamic weather. It can be sunny, rainy, or snowy in a single day! Also, you can see mountains, lakes, and even a big ice field in this park. **Discovering the Big Five**

– Kruger National Park

Have you heard about the Big Five? They are lions, leopards, elephants, rhinos, and buffaloes. You can see them all in Kruger National Park in South Africa. Many wild animals move around this park freely. If you are lucky, you can see rhinos which are sleeping under baobab trees.

However, the Big Five are in danger because of too much hunting. To protect the Big Five, the park has been a "no-hunting" area from the start. These days, drones and helicopters are used to monitor hunting activities.

Also, the park runs many nature volunteer programs. Volunteers monitor signs of illegal hunting activities and remove animal traps.

National parks preserve the Earth's past, present, and future. Thanks to them, future generations will also be able to experience many natural wonders.
