1. 다음을 듣고, 여자가 하는 말의 목적으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

W: Hello, students. This is Ms. Gray, your school librarian. As you know, our library facilities are outdated, and many of you have pointed out the need for improvements. To better serve your needs, we will be renovating the library during summer vacation. Renovations will begin on July 20th and be completed by August 10th. During that period, the library will be closed. We understand this may cause some inconvenience, especially for those who planned to use the library during vacation, but these improvements will ensure we provide a better library for everyone. Thank you for your understanding!

2. 대화를 듣고, 남자의 의견으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

M: Amy, you don't look happy. What's bothering you?

W: Hey, Daniel. I'm frustrated because my blog isn't attracting readers.

M: Hmm.... I like your blog, but I think the layout could be improved a bit.

W: Really? Could you tell me what I should change?

M: I think your headings should stand out more.

W: What do you mean by that?

M: Well, right now your headings look almost the same as the body text.

W: You mean readers might not notice where each section begins?

M: Exactly! If you make your headings more distinct, people will be able to read your blog more easily.

W: Okay, so I should work on the headings.

M: Right. Making the headings clearly different from the text is a good way to catch readers' attention.

W: Thanks. I'll change that right away.

W: Hello, listeners! This is Kelly from Wellness Talk. Today, many people feel lonely even when living in big cities. But here's something simple that helps. Research shows that small interactions with your neighbors can reduce loneliness. You don't need to have deep conversations or close relationships with them. Even simple actions like saying hello or waving to your neighbor can help you feel more connected to those around you. These brief moments of contact remind people that they are not alone. Everyday interactions show that you are part of a shared space and a community. If you want to support your well-being this week, start with one small greeting. It truly makes a difference.

4. 대화를 듣고, 그림에서 대화의 내용과 일치하지 않는 것을 고르시오.

W: Hi, Mark! Is this where we're going to hold the planting activity for kids?

M: Hey, Emma. Yes, I thought this area would be perfect.

W: Hello, garden lovers! Have you thought about how nature can take care of your garden? Today, let's talk about animals that can actually help your garden grow strong and healthy. First, we have ants, the tiny gardeners. They loosen the soil, so air and water can reach roots and they recycle dead insects into fertilizer, supporting natural plant growth. Second, spiders may look scary, but they're your garden's silent guards. They catch mosquitoes and flies, keeping your garden balanced and pest-free. Next, lizards help gardens by eating harmful pests and insects that damage plants. They keep the pest population under control organically, reducing the need for chemical pesticides. Lastly, earthworms improve the soil by creating a complex of tunnels that allows air and water to flow through the soil more easily. This helps the plants receive the nutrients they need more efficiently. So, remember these animals aren't just visitors — they're partners. By welcoming them, you're not only protecting your garden, but also giving back to nature.
